2022 Application to Paleontology Field School (ANTH 470)

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Course Description & Learning Objectives:

This 4-Credit biological anthropology course provides hands-on paleontological field and lab experience with a focus on primate-bearing fossil localities dated at ~56-52 Ma (early Eocene, Willwood Formation) in the Bighorn Basin, Wyoming. Participants will learn how to recover & identify vertebrate fossils, fossil collection methods, stratigraphy, paleosol development, field documentation & accession, and lab fossil preparation & cataloguing. Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to: (1) identify vertebrate fossil dental & skeletal elements; (2) employ field paleontology collection methods (surface collecting, excavation, etc.); (3) utilize stratigraphic and paleosol data to ascertain geologic age, environmental & biotic data; (4) document & prepare fossils for museum catalogue; (5) utilize lab technology; (6) produce a professional-grade field report based on field & lab data on an assigned taxon or locality.

 - e. Following the interview, you will be contacted about your participation status.
